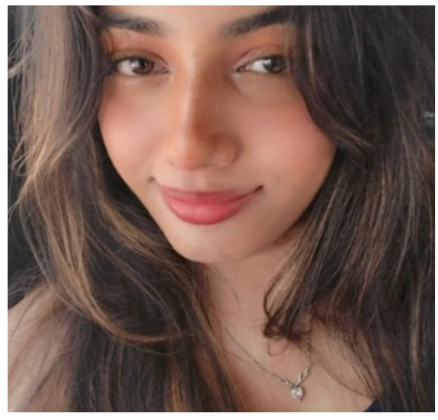
Note:
